01 For the Survivor



This year, we stood with survivors of unimaginable harm.

As lead trial counsel, we secured a \$20.75 million landmark bellwether trial verdict against a global bank for enabling genocide, paving the way to obtain billions of dollars in classwide relief for 20,000+ **Sudanese survivors** and setting a worldwide precedent for bank accountability.

We also fought for survivors of sexual violence, including **former WWE “Ring Boys”** who were abused as children, and young people in **Los Angeles County’s juvenile detention facilities** and **foster care systems**—where we helped achieve a historic \$4 billion settlement—pursuing accountability from perpetrators and the institutions that enabled their abuse.

02 For the Community

We helped communities recover from environmental disasters and corporate failures.

We represent thousands of **military families** exposed to toxic water at Camp Lejeune and partnered with **state governments** in major PFAS litigation to secure cleanup funding and protect public health.

We recovered over \$100 million for **Illinoisians** after the Chemtool fire and are pursuing justice for more than 90,000 **Georgians** affected by the Bio-Lab fire. In Los Angeles, we are helping **families** devastated by the Eaton Fire, the second most destructive wildfire in California history.

We represent **Greenville Water** in litigation over defective infrastructure that threatened water quality for more than 500,000 **county residents**, and we continue to fight for fair labor standards—advocating for tens of thousands of **corrections officers** in North Carolina and Wisconsin, where a recent Supreme Court ruling upheld class status.

We also partnered with the **City of San Francisco** in a first-of-its-kind lawsuit against major ultra-processed food manufacturers to hold them accountable for engineering a public health crisis and set a precedent to safeguard future generations.

03 For the Vulnerable



We fought for those who have long been overlooked and exploited.

We lead nationwide litigation against manufacturers of toxic hair relaxers marketed primarily to **Black women**, addressing products linked to hormone-sensitive cancers. Billions of dollars in damages are at stake as we seek accountability for decades of deception.

We also stand with **Native Nations** in landmark cases, including a lawsuit against the U.S. Government for its role in the Federal Indian Boarding School Program, which caused generational trauma and cultural erasure, as well as in actions against social media companies for fueling a youth mental health crisis that has harmed **young people**.

We represent the **City of Baltimore** in groundbreaking consumer protection actions against DraftKings and FanDuel for deceptive **consumer** practices involving online gambling and against the makers of Zyn nicotine pouches for deceptive marketing targeting **children**.

04 For the Consumer



We advocated for consumers harmed by corporate misconduct.

We secured a \$175 million post-verdict settlement for 28,000 **vehicle owners** after winning a rare automotive defect class action trial against General Motors. We were appointed to lead nationwide litigation over catastrophic GM 6.2L engine defects.

We advanced landmark antitrust cases on behalf of consumers, including **collectors** harmed by Fanatics and major U.S. sports leagues' trading card monopolies, **renters** affected by RealPage and large landlords' rental price-fixing, and **business customers** subjected to collusion in the rental equipment industry.

On the privacy front, we achieved a groundbreaking proposed settlement in the Google Real-Time Bidding litigation, giving hundreds of millions of **internet users** unprecedented control over their data. We also secured a \$42.5 million settlement for **customers** affected by the TMX Finance data breach involving millions of accounts.

In addition, we lead multidistrict litigation on behalf of **drivers** whose data was secretly harvested and shared by GM, OnStar, and data brokers. We also lead a class action for **Adobe users** harmed by the company's online tracking and monetization.

05 For the Whistleblower

Whistleblowers shine a light on fraud and corruption—often at great personal risk.

This year, we secured a major appellate victory in the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, reviving a False Claims Act suit brought by **whistleblowers** exposing over \$6 million in Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loan fraud.

The decision reinforces the critical role whistleblowers play in safeguarding the interests of **taxpayers** and holding corporations accountable.



06 For the Investor



We championed transparency and accountability in financial markets.

This year, we were appointed Lead Counsel in a class action against Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company, representing **teachers** and **public employees** who were misled about undisclosed fees on retirement annuities.

We also lead a shareholder class action against AstraZeneca, challenging alleged securities violations tied to its healthcare operations—protecting **investors** and demanding integrity from one of the world’s largest pharmaceutical companies.

In addition, we filed a nationwide class action on behalf of **account holders** against Osaic for breaching fiduciary duties by underpaying interest in its cash sweep programs, seeking to recover millions in losses and hold financial institutions accountable.

07 For the Future



In 2025, we expanded our reach to best serve the evolving needs of our **clients**.

With the future in mind, we grew to more than 100 **lawyers**, opened a new **office** in Las Vegas, and added **partners** in Boston, Cleveland, New York, San Diego, and Washington, DC.

We built every case as if it would go to verdict. The **DiCello Levitt Trial Center** conducted more than 70 focus groups with nearly 1,000 participants, reinforcing our commitment to excellence in the courtroom and a trial-first mindset.
